1. Consent Agenda
 - a. The meeting of May 7, 2015 was called to order at 5:35pm. Minutes of April 2, 2015 and a current financial report were approved.
2. Cpt. Bill Bongle Recognition
 - a. Bill Bongle, Captain of District D for the Green Bay Police Department, retired on May 1st with 29 years working for the GBPD. On behalf of the GBNLC, Cheryl Renier-Wigg showed some pictures, told a few stories, and presented a certificate of appreciation to Captain Bongle to thank him for all the work he has done for the Green Bay neighborhoods.
3. Live54218
 - a. Ann Moeller presented on behalf of Melinda Morella, who could not be present at the meeting. Live54218 is a non-profit that works to create environments in the community that support and promote all residents daily in consuming 5 fruits and vegetables, drinking 4 bottles of water, having less than 2 hours of screen time, participating in at least 1 hour of physical activity, and sleeping 8 hours a night. Live54218 will be working with Aurora BayCare for the Open Streets Event on Saturday, July 11th from 10:00am-2:00pm.
