 - Celestine Jeffreys spoke on behalf of the Mayor Schmitt. State of the City Address is coming up on April 12th.
3. Green Bay Area School District Referendum
 - Guest speakers Dr. Michelle Langenfeld and Mike Blecha presented information about the 2 upcoming school referendums being voted on Tuesday, April 4th. The first referendum is an Operational Referendum for \$16.5 million and the 2nd referendum is a Facilities Referendum for \$68.5 million. According to the speakers, these would result in no tax increase to homeowners. A power point presentation was given explaining the details of each referendum.
4. Early History of the Green Bay Fire Department
 - Guest speaker David Siegel from the Green Bay Fire Department gave a presentation about the beginning story of the Fire Department and a conflagration that took place on the East side of Green Bay.
