1. Consent Agenda
 - a. The meeting of October 1, 2015 was called to order at 5:30pm. A reminder was made that seating at the tables in the "U" shape is limited to the Presidents (or a NHA representative attending in place of a President) due to limited seating. Guests and other Neighborhood Association members are more than welcome to attend the GBNLC meetings, but are pleased asked to sit at the round tables in the back.
 - b. Minutes of August 6, 2015 and a current financial report were approved.
2. Mayor's Report
 - a. Due to scheduling conflicts, the Mayor was unable to attend the GBNLC meeting of October 1, 2015.
3. Sex Offender Processes
 - a. Lt. Andy Opperman of the GBPD spoke briefly on the Sex Offender Release Board, which is a board comprised of law enforcement professionals and other officials that make release determinations for sex offenders in the City of Green Bay on a case-by-case basis.
 - b. Erica Frantz, Registration Specialist with the Wisconsin Sex Offender Registry Program, spoke on sex offender registration law in the state of Wisconsin. She emphasized that the intent of the registry is not to create fear or outrage, but is to increase awareness for community members and to hold sex offenders accountable. That being said, she went over the different levels of sex offense, who is required to register, as well as what WI law requires for special bulletin notifications.
