Roll Call

1. Consent Agenda

- a. The minutes from August's meetings were approved.
- b. The financial report was approved, although Dave Catalano (McAuliffe Park) noted the new budget line of brat barn income. Cheryl also asked for budget input requests for 2017's budget.
- c. Cheryl Renier-Wigg reminded everyone of the importance of being fiscally responsible. When one neighborhood association does not pay their bills on time, it reflects poorly on all neighborhood associations.
- d. Captain Brad Florence of District D introduced himself to the GBNLC members. He has long been a member of the Green Bay police department. He said for neighborhoods, his goal is to make speeding a priority.
- e. Cheryl Renier-Wigg also introduced the two new co-presidents of Navarino Neighborhood Association – Cindy Mills and Gina Greatens, as well as Tammy

Van Ess, the president of newly formed Royal Ponds Preserve Neighborhood Association.

2. Mayor's Report
 - a. Mayor Jim Schmitt talked briefly about the importance of neighborhoods to the City of Green Bay's success.
 - b. Also discussed was the re-development of the East Town Mall. Mayor Schmitt hopes to have neighborhood approval for the development of a new "power center" style mall, turning the mall "inside out".
 - i. He also discussed his hopes to partner with Brown County to get the East Branch of the library into the new mall development.
 - c. Mayor Schmitt also introduced Celestine Jefferys as the new Chief of Staff for the Mayor's office.
3. Inspection University
 - a. Cheryl Renier-Wigg and Inspector Scott Nelson discussed a power point presentation on the inspection process and the following points:
 - i. The Community and Economic Development Department – organizational chart – how the department is set up.
 - ii. Common neighborhood complaints –including trash storage, litter, and parking on the lawn.
 - iii. The complaint process – including which departments to contact for specific issues, Public Works, Police Department, or Inspection office.
 - iv. A copy of the slides for who to contact and their information will be sent out to all neighborhood associations.
4. City Staff Updates
 - a. Emily Turriff discussed the results of the Accomplishment/Need Survey sent out to all neighborhood associations in September. 19/38 associations responded.
 - i. A handout was given out with items/issue that associations needed help with.
 - ii. A call was made for any associations who hadn't turned in surveys to do so.
 - iii. Cheryl Renier-Wigg added that associations who were good at certain items would be asked to give future presentations.
 - b. Cheryl Renier-Wigg discussed the how neighborhood associations can make a difference in items on the City Council meeting agenda. If neighborhood associations are not present, it seems like they do not care about the issues.
 - i. City Staff will work on keeping neighborhood associations updated on City Council agenda items as much as possible.
 - c. Cheryl Renier-Wigg also asked for any associations who wanted a CSI presence at their Halloween Events to please email her the details.
5. Open Forum
 - a. Rosa Herrera (Olde North) made a request for the power point slides about the organization chart and contact information for different departments be emailed to the presidents.
 - b. Joe Rabideau (Fritsch Park) stated that Fritsch Park's annual meeting is on October 11th at 5pm.
