DISCUSSION : Inactive Neighborhoods

Will Peters initiated the discussion about his work with Inactive Neighborhoods and reorganizations including:

Wilder Park: Scott is still dealing with the projection equipment. Consensus to move toward making a contractual arrangement with him.

Areas needing new leadership: Old Norwood ; New Railway Garden; Lombardi, North Baird (Trailer Park) Noel's area on north side of Deckner Ave (not part of Preble Park).

DISCUSSION: USE OF GBNLC status of tax exemption for use by individual neighborhoods to use when applying for outside grants such as the Brown County Crime grants.

Does GBNLC want/is willing to be a fiscal agent for individual neighborhoods???

Maybe as long as the certain percentage of fundraising is included as part of the return to GBNLC? Requested that Will check with the Brown County Law Enforcement Foundation people if they will waive the requirement of the tax exempt status for neighborhoods?
