 - a. None
3. New Developments in Green Bay, Director of Community and Economic Development, Kevin Vonck
 - a. Kevin Vonck spoke about the opportunity of people with differing viewpoints and backgrounds coming together to solve common problems and create future developments. He gave a summary of some of the larger developments happening in Green Bay such as the University Corridor Project, Strategic Behavioral Health in the I43 Business District, Hotel Northland-Downtown, Metreau Apartments, Larsen Green, and Events Center on S. Broadway. He is looking to supply more information to the neighborhoods through social media and more presentations to the GBNLC. Some commented they would like the Presidents of the Neighborhood Associations to be notified of upcoming projects and developments in their neighborhoods. This is something that will be addressed and looked into improving in the future.
4. Brown County Parks and Trails, Assistant Park Director, Brown County, Matt Kriese
 - a. Matt gave a summary of the different offerings that our area has which extends to all of Brown County. These consist of over 170 Campsites, camping opportunities at the Brown County Fair Grounds, playgrounds where kids go to learn, and available rental facilities. He commented that Pamperin Park has been rented 170 times this year up until May and the they are booked out till next June. There are also hunting and snow mobiling opportunitites and many different parks available for hiking. The Fox River trail is connected to a couple of other counties. A State Trail

pass is available for \$5 per day or \$25 for annual pass. No tax money is used for maintenance of the trails so these fees are very important for their upkeep. Everything, except walking, requires a Pass.
